



Mom explained to me whay you didn't write in the season before Christmas. I hear from bis about once a week and frommy wife and Mom, about every day. Some days, like today, we don't recieve mail but it is very rare not to get any. You have no idea of how much we look forward to sail from home. Any so of news we are hungery for over here.

Tonight, I have to work all nite long and we went on duty at 8 am this morning. Do this about three times seach week and have to work 24 hours straight through. Funny, we don't mind this at all for we all know and understand that there is a war to be won! Today, I was driving along in a jeep and pick up two little English kids who had never had a ride in a jeep before. They were sure thrilled and got a big kick out of it. Next week some time, I'm going down to London and see all of the sights. I've already visited Cembridge the town of 19 colleges. intended to see all of the towns that I can. English people have many different customs than we do. Since I've been over here, caught the tes habit and have to have my afternoon ten each day. I've been lucky so fa and haven't missed Mass once on account of duty. Well, I will close thi for now. God bless you. Sonny

Dear Aunt Mary, The fact of pulling C Q tonight, I have a lot of spare time for a change and can pound out a lot of letters that I owe to so many people. You just can't understand how busy we are and how every second is taking up. I'm lucky to grind out a letter to the family and Peanuts. Some time ago, I put in a application for the privilege of voting and I'm waiting for my ballot to arrive. No need to say where I will place my big X.

I suppose the people in the States are going wild with the incoming wonderful war news. Over here we take it . mildly but inside we are cheering with joy for we know soon we'll go marching home to our love owes. It's hard to explain how we feel inside being away from our families, our life and happiness. All I can say --- I can't wait until that glorious day that once again I can don the free airs of a civilian. America is truly worth fighting for, we over here know. Sounds rather silly, but we miss the little things that every one takes for granted. I miss all types of wholesome American foods and eating hot dogs or hamburges. I miss the fun of a dance, cokes and all of those sorts of thing. I miss going to a real chruch each Sunday with my littlw wife. Above all, I miss my family and wife. Thank goodness this awful feeling is just about over. Victory and peace is in the air and it is now just a question of time. Pray real hard that it will end soon as possible.

Next week a couple of buddies of mine and I are going on a furhough to Scotland. Seven days of restful leave from the routines of a army at war. Seven free days to do as we want, sleep as we want and to have fun. One of the fellows going with me is the photographer in S-2's public relations dept. Chuck is a ex-photographer from the Cleveland News and a old news paper man from way back. He is taking along two of his cameras, one of the candid type and one of the news paper type. With the camera that I'm borrowing, we shall have a tour of Scotand on pictures. I shall send 'em to the family and Peanuts with a written account of the trip. Mom will bring them out to you etc. Our first stop will be in Edinburgh and from there to Glasgow. I want to see the famous Moors of Scotland and take some good photos of them

I shall write you a graphic letter on my return. Well, I have to write a letter to Sis, so I will close down for this time. Fray real hard for the end of this war to hurry up. For further news, call Mom or Peanuts. God Bless you and loads of love.
