Dear Sir,

Your letter came duly to hand, enclosing a list of moneys I had paid moneys to but no particulars what ever, now I cannot make out any thing by that, as you do not state what the money was paid for.

You say my account is not satisfactory, and you want to know what every cent has been spent on, well when I get back to Mansfield I will give you more particulars, but I think you know what Bills not rendered means, without asking me, as you will find that I sent from Pittsburgh before we started that I had given \$5000 for trade of Boat, and that I had to give 75 for Pilot, and there is no bill rendered for that, but I shall not be able to tell every cent I spent for the company for I shall perhaps be \$40. or 50 that I have spent for which I have no account.

But there is another thing, while at Pittsburgh I lent the company \$500.
