Patterson and on the ground that secret societies are not desirable, the petition is rejected. Col. Clark reports Cadet Joe Row for having

left his room when master arrested. From investigation it appeared that Carol Rice was acting under orders, as the senior had slipped from his room to the room opposite to admonish the inmates to quiet. Happening that he acted in ignorance and in good faith, the charge against him was dismissed and he was ordered to be admonished. — There were appointed to <sup>serve</sup> act in conjunction with Col. Clark on the Board of Discipline for the ensuing year: For November<sup>87</sup> Prof. White and Shackleford, for December 1887 Prof. Nettle and School. For January 1888 Prof. Potter and Logan, for February 88 Prof. H. H. There being no other business, Faculty adjourned.
