

State University of Kentucky.
December 9, 1910.

The faculty met in adjourned session in the usual place at 3:30 P.M., those present being President Patterson, Acting President White, Professors Curtis, Frankel, Hamilton, Hooper, Jones, Kelly, Lafferty, Mathews, Maxson, Mustaine, Norwood, Patterson, Pence, Pryor, Scovell, Snow, Stout, Wilson, Zembrod.

On motion of President Patterson, seconded by Professor Frankel, it was ordered on account of the limited number present that the final consideration of Section 13 of the report of Professor Mackenzie for the Committee upon Class Standing and Examinations be postponed.

The report of the Special Committee upon Military Science and Physical Education was then taken up section by section.

On motion of Lieut. Kelly, seconded by Professor Hooper, it was ordered that the first section, after a verbal amendment, be adopted as follows:-

- (1) Resolved that Military Science and Physical Education be put on the same basis as other courses of study in the University.

On motion it was ordered that Section 2, after some minor amendment, be adopted as follows:

- (2) Resolved that Military Science be a course of two years with a minimum of three hours per week to be satisfactorily completed by the close of the Sophomore year; that this course be required of all students with the exceptions herein noted. Students entering below the grade of Juniors from other institutions or the Academy may present credits in this department to exempt them partially or wholly from this military instruction at the option of the Commandant. Drill is not required of Juniors and Seniors except to make up deficiencies incurred in this or other institutions where military drill is a prescribed part of the course.

Sections 3, 4 and 5, to which no objections were raised, were then adopted by general consent as follows:

- (3) Resolved that drill be compulsory during the second and third years of the course in the Academy.
- (4) Resolved that these rules apply also to the Department of Physical Education for both men and women, except that the minimum for compulsory attendance is two hours per week during the Freshman and Sophomore years, exemption credits to be allowed at the option of the professors in charge of these departments.
- (5) Resolved that these rules become effective on and after August, 1911.

The reading of Section 6 was followed by an extended discussion participated in by President Patterson, Professors Lafferty, Scovell and W.K.Patterson. Judge Lafferty, seconded by Dr.Snow, then moved that the section as reported by the committee be adopted. Judge Lafferty, seconded by Dr.Snow, moved the previous question. Upon its being put to vote it was ordered that the faculty proceed to a consideration of the main question. The original question was then put to vote, and the ayes and noes being called for, the result as announced was ayes 10, noes 6. Attention was called to the fact that owing to the absence of a quorum, some members having left the meeting, the result of the vote was inoperative.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
