desire to give appropriate expression of their
sense of loss in the death of their fellow
citizen and co-worker in the education of
youth, - Prof. J. B. Skinner President of
Hamilton College.

We have ever ^{had} him in high esteem,
because of his superior abilities, his
noble manhood and his unvarying
courtesy - a courtesy inspired and informed
by the divine charity that controlled his
whole life and won for him the
appreciation and lofty regard of his
fellow men.

We assure his wife of our tender
sympathy with her in this hour of
her unspeakable sorrow, and beseech
for her and children the comfort and
and guidance of the God of all grace
and consolation.

As a mark of our respect, ^{we} will be
represented at his funeral by a committee of
our number.

We request the President of our College
to communicate our action to Mrs.
Skinner and the Faculty of Hamilton College.

The foregoing was approved; and the Chairman appointed the following Committee, viz: Prof. Shackelford, Neville, White, Kastle and Brooks, to attend the funeral as representatives of the Faculty.

The chairman called attention to the fact that it was near the time for the regular meeting and suggested that it might be well to denominate this the regular meeting for March. There was no objection.

On motion of Prof. Shackelford ordered that a committee be appointed to determine the class honors of the Senior class for the current year.

The chair appointed the Deans of the several courses of study.

The matter was referred to the classical faculty for its consideration.
