Delinquencies
in Military
Dept.

On behalf of Com. appointed to consider delinquencies in the Military department Prof. Kastle's report reported as follows; -

Lexington, Kentucky, Nov, 26th, 1902.

To the President and Faculty of
the State College of Kentucky.

Gentlemen,

The Committee recently appointed to consider the matter of delinquencies on the part of certain students in the Military Department of the College, would report as follows:-

- 1st. That all absences from drill upto this date be excused.
- 2nd. That in the future any absence from drill must be made up by squad drill on Saturday afternoon.
- 3rd. That any student failing to report for squad drill when so ordered, unless excused by the Commandant, be dismissed from the institution.
- 4th. That no military punishments be inflicted for offenses other than those involving a breach of military discipline.

On motion of Prof. Roark, seconded by Prof. Kastle, it was ordered that the chair appoint a com. to take under advisement the organization of such a summer school, and that this com. should report to the faculty as soon as possible.
