The faculty met in the President's office at 12 o'clock to take action relative to the death of Professor John H. Neville. The following members were present, President Patterson, Professors White, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Mackenzie, Wilson, Zembrod, Tuttle, Frankel, Lafferty, Maxson, Hooper, Stout, Melcher, Eastin.

Professor White, chairman, submitted the following resolutions on behalf of his committee:-

The Faculty of Kentucky State University having learned of the death of its oldest member, desires to express in a few words, free from eulogy, its sense of the loss the University and the State have sustained.

The death of Professor John Henry Neville has closed the long and useful career of one of Kentucky's most learned scholars and educators. Beloved of all who knew him he held a warm place in the hearts of a large circle of friends.

To the thousands of students who knew him in the State College his departure means the passing from earthly view of a great teacher whose precepts will remain with them through life, encouraging them to better and more useful lives.

To the young men in our Faculty his scholarly attainments, his clear judgement, and his ability to attract and to instruct his pupils will be a goal worthy of their highest efforts.

To the older men in our Faculty his departure means the loss of a very dear friend.

To the members of his family we desire to express our sincere sympathy and to assure them that their sorrow is ours. With them we hope and believe that his life beyond the grave will be one of eternal happiness.

It was furthermore stated that it appeared to be the preference of the family of Professor Neville that no ostentatious display be made and that it would be preferable for the Faculty members to attend the funeral as individuals rather than in a body, but it was hoped that all would be present.

The President called attention to the regular meeting of the Faculty which would occur upon Friday, at 3:30 P.M.
