#### SCAN DATABASE IN BRS

Two years ago, the Government Publications Department became a repository for the U.S. Administration on Aging's (AoA) SCAN microfiche collection. The collection contains research documents and articles in the field of gerontology. GPD has received 3,000 microfiche to date. However, access has been limited as recent budget cuts have eliminated plans for an abstract journal and index. Now, the AoA has announced that as of December 1981, SCAN documents will go into the National Technical Information Services (NTIS) Database, hardcopy and microfiche will be available from NTIS, and the database may be accessed through Bibliographic Research Service (BRS), which is available in Data Service in the King Library Reference Department. GPD will continue to receive the SCAN documents on microfiche.

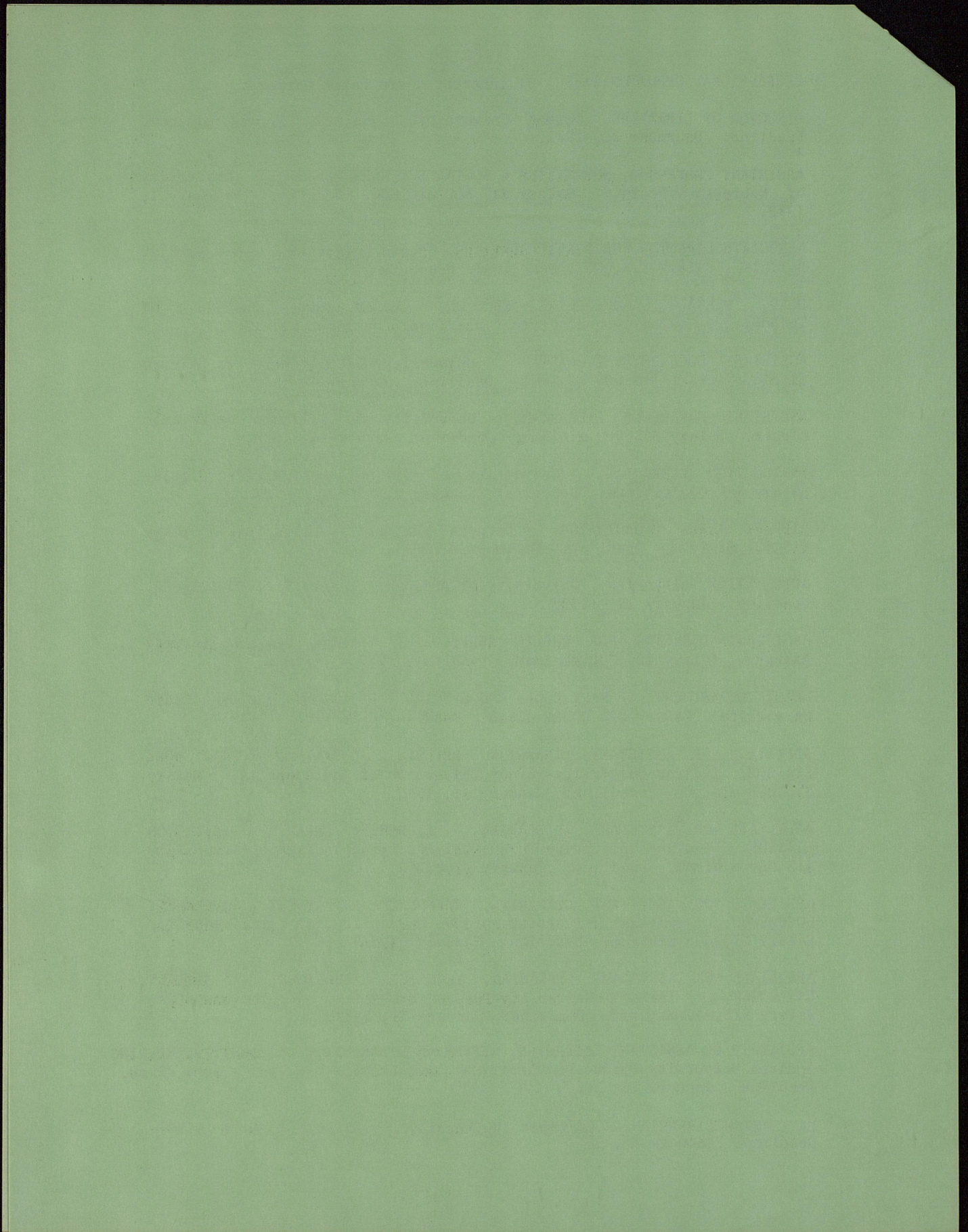

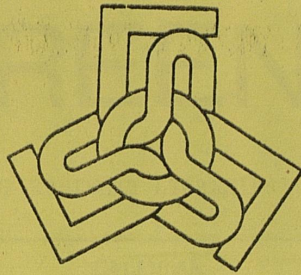






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#### LSO ELECTIONS
