RESULTS of SURVEY of POLICIES, GUIDELINES and RULES COMMITTEE

Based upon the results of their recent survey of the professional staff, the members of the Policy, Guidelines, and Rules Committee will be examining the Libraries' policies and procedures relating to internal communication.
