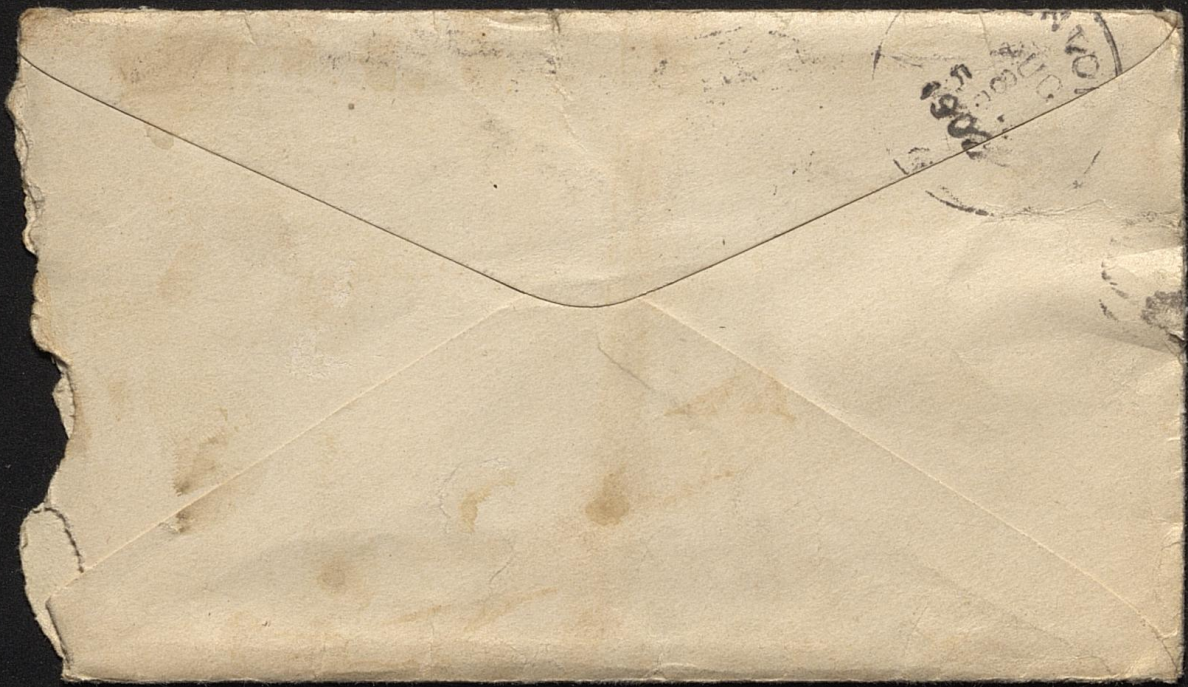

Oh Howard I forgot to tell

to California last Monday
on the eleven there is an
excursion out there I was
thinking now would be your
time to come home it would
not cost you so much.

well good bye my best
wishes from Ida

year, and we wont have no
corn if we dont have more
rain, the frost frooze every
thing off had to plant all our
beans over it frooze the potatoes
tops but they have started out
again, am afraid they will
be a poor crop

Well a change Cora has a boy
born Friday morning about six
oclock and on the 6th I tell you
Will is a proud man and
Leua & Anna is no better some
proud people in Benton now
they sent for me I got there
about 15 minutes before it came
in time to wash & dress it
she got along nicely

Will Harrington and his
Wife & her children are here
now came Thursday going to
stay till fall, Della are down
and they sent for Woods
and had their pictures taken
over back of Albert's barn on
the rocks. I was over and
helped fix them, now Mrs
Harrington is happy got her
children together, Nor & Reese
was here today said Luella was
about the same, the rest is
well, Oh Howard Harry Long
Wife is quite pleased that
will be something nice in that
family, Maude is quite sick
she is at Long's had started
to go to Shickshing and was
taken sick, I bet Maude is
worse Brad just went by so
fast think he gone after the Dr

I will stop and go up and
see her I have not been up yet
will finish when I come back

Monday afternoon

I was up & Maude was very
bad all night. I stayed till
this morning. The Dr was up
this morning and said she was

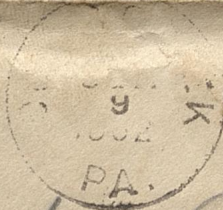

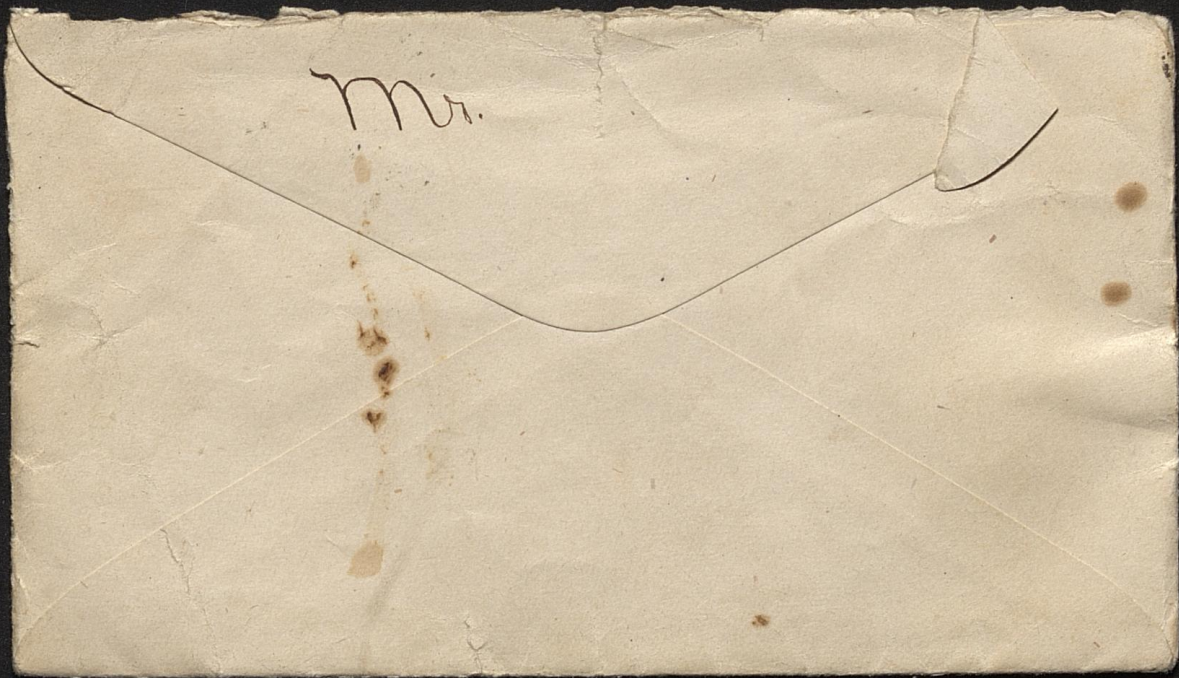

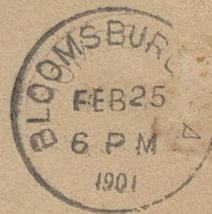
Bloomsburg Feb 25th 1901
