

SHAKERTOWN INN.

Famous Shakertown Inn, in the heart of the Blue Grass, and also in the heart of the most beautiful scenery in Kentucky, where the service is unexcelled and the comfort is perfect. Sister Mary Settles, the last surviving member. She was born October 30, 1836, and died March 29th, 1923. The wonderful buildings in Shaker Village in perfect condition today, are more than a century old, and are mute witnesses that the Shakers built not on the sand.

Dix Dam — Dix Dam is the largest rock filled dam in the United States; approximately one hundred feet higher than Niagara Falls, it is 920 feet long, and at the river bed 700 feet thick. It is seven miles from Shaker Village.

High Bridge is the highest bridge in the United States over a navigable stream. It is 1,230 feet long, and 308 feet above normal stage river. High Bridge is four miles from Shaker Village.

Brooklyn Bridge crosses the Kentucky River; is regarded as the most beautiful of all river views. Brooklyn Bridge is six miles from Shaker Village.

On the site of old Fort Harrod, Harrodsburg, Kentucky, in the last year has been erected a replica of the original. Harrodsburg is called the Colonial Town of Kentucky, and it is justly entitled to that distinction. Fort Harrod and Harrodsburg, Kentucky, are eight miles from Shaker Village. Shaker Village is twenty-four miles from Lexington; 101 miles from Louisville; 124 miles from Cincinnati; 45 miles from "My Old Kentucky Home", now a state park at Bardstown, Kentucky. It is 70 miles from the Lincoln Memorial; and 125 miles from Mammoth Cave; which are all places of wonderful interest.
