**January 15 (Monday)** Registration for new students. Ballroom open for fee payment and I.D. pictures or validation, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., through Friday, Jan. 19.

**January 16 (Tuesday)** Centralized add/drop for advance registered students only.

**January 17 (Wednesday)** Classes Begin; Arts & Sciences add/drop in Buell Armory, thereafter in Dean's office. All other add/drop in college deans' offices.

**January 17 & 18** Late registration for returning students who did not advance register and for new students cleared late for admission. Mezzanine, Patterson Office Tower, 8:30-4:00. A \$20 late fee is charged for late registration.

**January 19 (Friday)** Last day to pay fees in ballroom.

**January 19-23** Late registration continues in Advising Conference Office, 204 Miller Hall, 8:30 to 4:30.

**January 23 (Tuesday)** Last day to enter an organized class.

**January 30 (Tuesday)** Last day to pay registration fees to avoid cancellation of registration. Pay in Billings and Collections Office, 220 Service Building. Last day for new students to pick up I.D. cards from Billings and Collections without paying replacement fee.

**February 8 (Thursday)** Last day for reinstatement of students cancelled for not paying registration fees. Must pay registration plus \$50 reinstatement fee.

**February 15 (Thursday)** Last day to file for May degree in college dean's office.

**February 16 (Friday)** Last day to pay spring health fee.

**February 20 (Tuesday)** Last day to change grading options, see college dean's office. Last day to drop a course with no indication of course on transcript record.

**March 9 (Friday)** Last day to drop a course. Last day to withdraw from the University or reduce schedule and receive any refund.

**March 19-24** Spring break.

**April 16-25** Advance registration for summer and fall.

**May 7** Final exams begin.

**May 12** End of semester.

## Welcome back and good luck with registration, fees, add/drop etc.

Welcome back from Christmas Vacation. If you're like most students, you've got some unfinished business to take care of with your schedule or with fee payment. This special edition of the **Kernel** can be of help in going through the procedures.

For students who will be adding on Tuesday, Jan. 16, the official course lists of classes that are still open are inside. Whether that additional courses may open up on the day, while open courses may get booked up.

Keep the fee payment deadline in mind. Friday, Jan. 30 is the last day to pay in the 220 Service Building. If you miss that deadline, Feb. 8 is the last day to avoid being dropped entirely by paying a \$50 reinstatement fee.

For students who are receiving financial aid, the checks are to be picked up in the Ballroom during fee payment week. Other financial and academic deadlines are listed in the spring calendar at left.

Interested in campus parking? A small number of student parking permits are usually available at the start of the spring semester. They are issued on a first-come, first-served basis to full-time junior, senior and graduate students. Permits for off-campus students will be issued at the parking office, 305 Euclid Ave., at 8:30 a.m., Thursday, Jan. 18. Permits for residence hall students will be issued at 1:30 that day.

## Changes in fee payment policy start to show results

This is the third semester for change in fee payment procedures, and University officials say the new system is already showing dividends.

The tougher new policy, which uses a single \$50 reinstatement fee as a penalty for late payment, has resulted in better organization and service at the billings and collections office, according to Tony Day, billings and collections manager.

"From a management standpoint, it's much better," said Day. "We can gear a specific amount of time to employ part-time people" during collections, he said. The closed deadlines help his department work more efficiently, said Day.

There has been a slight increase in the number of students who have paid tuition on time, according to Judy Marshall, business affairs ombudswoman.

The figures support that conclusion. Under the old policy in the 1977 fall semester, 791 students were dropped for non-payment, according to Day. One year later under the new policy, in the fall semester of 1978, 682 students were dropped.

Before the 1978 spring semester, students who were late in paying fees would have to pay a \$20 reinstatement fee, along with a \$5 late fee which could be paid at any time before the end of the semester.

The old policy, installed in the 1950s, had been taken advantage of, said Jack Blanton, vice president of business affairs. Students could delay paying until they were certain they had passed courses, and long lines often formed at the Service Building payment office (4,500 students were late in paying fees in the 1977 fall semester). In addition, Blanton said then, the \$5 semester-long "carrying charge" was a steal compared to commercial loan rates.

The deadlines for fee payment this year are Tuesday, Jan. 30, to escape paying the \$50 reinstatement fee, and Thursday, Feb. 8, to avoid being dropped for non-payment.

The deadline for final payment this semester is eight days earlier than it was in the spring semester of 1978, but it's not because of any policy change, said Day. Guidelines call for

reinstatement to be made within 10 days of the regular payment deadline, but the official 1978 spring calendar had already been compiled and could not be changed, said Day. The time period for this semester is in line with the fee-payment policy.

There is one alternative to paying the reinstatement charge, one way to remain enrolled after Feb. 8 without paying fees: sign a promissory note with the University.

But only a few students are eligible for that option, according to Marshall of the Business Affairs office. UK's policy is to issue promissory notes when there is evidence that a student's

grant or scholarship has been delayed. "It's not something we try to publicize or encourage," said David Prater of the financial aid office.

Issuing promissory notes gives the University some flexibility for special cases, but the policy is strict. "We try to explain that we don't sign notes in cases where money from jobs or parents is late in coming," said Prater.

Students who are eligible for promissory notes must present convincing evidence that their grants or scholarships will come in. Prater said he couldn't remember a case when a student's funds didn't arrive, although he said there were students

who spent the money on things other than fees, and were dropped from the University.

Last semester was an unusually busy period for promissory notes, said Prater, because of backups in the Basic Educational Opportunity Grant program. Many BEOG allocations were delayed because of auditing that was supposed to check for fraud, but also kept many students anxiously awaiting funds. In some cases, said Prater, BEOG money (ranging from \$176 to \$1,600) didn't arrive until the first of November.

The University will soon use a computerized billings and collections

procedure that is now being developed, officials say. The programming for such a system is only now being prepared, and the date of installment has not been set, so it's uncertain how the system will affect students.

According to Marshall, computerized billing will probably involve payment in advance of all fees, similar to procedures used at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green. Such a system may also involve separate accounts for each student, with tuition, room, board and other University fees being charged in a single bill, said Day.

## To understand add/drop, divide it into simple steps

To have an enjoyable add/drop, it helps to break down the process into simple steps:

First, obtain an add/drop form at your college office. Fill it out and locate either your college dean or advisor for an official signature. Without the signed form, you can't pass through the first checkpoint at Memorial Coliseum on Tuesday.

Next, report to the coliseum at the correct time (see insert at right).

After you've been admitted, go to the upper coliseum levels and find the departmental tables for the classes you're changing.

Here the add/drop form is given to the department representative, who will give you the computer card if the class is open. It helps to move quickly, because courses might not have openings for very long.

If you've dropping a course, take the form to the opposite departmental table for a computer drop card.

Next, take the computer cards to your dean's table for final approval and recording of class transactions.

The University pre-registered 17,395 students for this semester, completing about 80,000 class

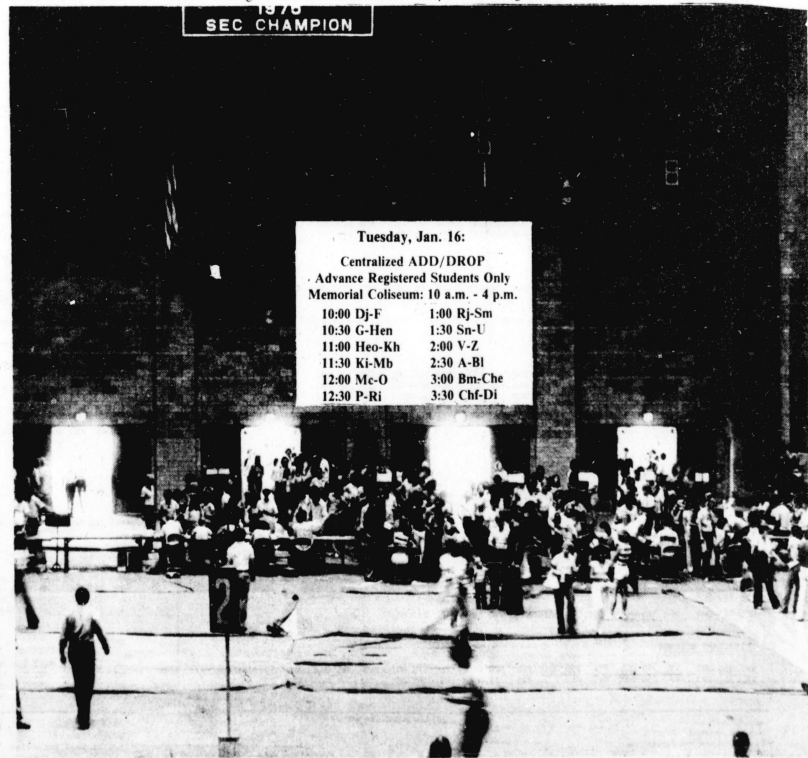
requests, said Associate Registrar George Dexter.

Admissions officials have traditionally complained about the abuse of the add/drop process, saying that many students strain the system by doing their main scheduling work through it.

Dexter, though, said that problem has been alleviated this year, because departments have been better able to estimate which courses will be in demand. The numbers of students who enroll in particular courses is normally a reliable indicator for what the interest will be from one semester to the next, he said.

But sometimes there are difficulties in meeting demands for certain classes. The biology 110 course taught by Nicholas Pisacano, for instance, is one of the most over-requested courses at the University, said Dexter. Biology 110 was requested by 920 students for this semester, but the two sections of the class only have room for 600 students, Dexter said. Pisacano's schedule doesn't allow him to teach more than the two sections.

In all, there were 700 students with incomplete schedules for this semester, said Dexter.
