

Minutes of the University Senate - May 15, 1933.

Doctor McVey further announced that the Baccalaureate Exercises would be held Sunday, May 28, in Memorial Hall and that President W. J. Hutchins of Berea would be the speaker.

The President stated that the budget for 1933-34 had not been sent out to the Deans and Heads of Departments as formerly due to uncertainty as to the results of the Federal Economy Bill. He stated that he probably would have more definite information within the next ten days. He stated that it would probably be necessary to impound five per cent of the salaries for next year, the amount withheld to be paid to staff members on the last month of the year, provided the money was available.

English 133 - Development of American Realism. Three hours; three credits.

Library 25 - General Reference - change in title to Use of the Library.
No change in content or credits.

Education 194 - The Education of the Individual. Two credits;

The College of Arts and Sciences presented the following recommendation which was approved:

Change in Requirement for A.B. in Journalism, General Sequence.
Journalism 109. Critical Writing for the Press, will be condensed and incorporated in Journalism 107, Editorial Writing. It is requested therefore that the requirement of Journalism 109 in the first semester of the senior year of the general sequence be omitted and that its place be taken by a 3 credit elective numbered above 100.

The Registrar raised a question in regard to the estimation of credits for honors. There was a motion that honors be based on courses presented for the degree. A substitute motion was offered that honors be granted on the basis of the student's entire record. The substitute motion was adopted.
