#### INFORMATION FROM THE PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Acid migration - (loose enclosures can damage pages and also contain acid). Discoloration such as end paper turning yellow, brown spots, or freckling can come not only from enclosures but from acid parts of the book itself, such as the presence of so-called protective tissues over the illustrations. These have been put into books to prevent the ink used for printing the illustrations from offsetting onto the pages. These tissues sometimes turn brown because of acid content, transferring this acid to the illustrations and to the opposite leaves. Other acid parts are end papers and binder's boards.
