

In pursuance of an order of Survey made by the Lee Circuit Court in the suit of James McGuire, Plaintiff, against Alfred Thompson, &c., defendants proceeded on the 27th day of November, 1872, with Claibourn Crawford & James Markham sworn chainmen to survey and lay down the calls of a deed made from James McGuire Senr. to the plaintiff James McGuire which boundary so run and laid down is shown upon the Plat with explanatory notes. Again on the 28th day of November, 1872, I proceeded with John McGuire and William Marshall Sworn chainmen to survey and lay down the boundary of a deed from Hieronymous to the defendant Thompson which so run and laid down is shown on the plat with red drawn lines from figure 51 to 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, &c. around to the beginning at 51. It will be seen by reference to the plat the 3000 acre patent and the Plaintiffs deed from his father covers and includes a part of the land deeded by Hieronymous to Thompson. Should the closing line of the 3000 acre patent be established as claimed by the Plaintiff then his deed from his father covers and includes all the land shown on the plat in green and yellow pencil marked boundary. Should the closing line be established from the large beech at figure 38 than McGuire would only hold to the extent of the yellow pencil marked boundary. And if the 3000 acre survey be established by confining the various calls up the river to the meanders thereof and binding on the North bank of the same and then run the closing line from where the N 52 W 1200 pole line terminates then the 3000 acre patent upon that plan of survey would not come in contact with any part of Thompson's land claimed under his Hieronymous deed which will more fully appear by reference to the plat. It will be observed however that this last named plan of survey is laid down by protraction and the distance up the river from figure 30 to 39 is estimated and taken by observation and might if actually surveyed turn out quite differently. For excess of distance in closing up the 3000 acre Adams and Crow patent reference is made to a former report of survey made out and on file in this suit. All of which is very respectfully submitted.
