Be it remembered that on the 18th day of May 1848
the following Bill in Chancery was filed in the
Clerk's office of said Court, which reads in words
and figures as follows (to wit)

To the Honorable Judge of the Owsley
Circuit in Chancery sitting Your Obedt^r Frank
Hieronymus respectfully represents that
some time in the 18th and Benjamin
St White purchased a certain tract of land
lying in the County of now Owsley containing
about 2000 acres which purchase was from
one Downey McCord and all of the purchase
money was paid by said White and thereon
the said Downey McCord made the said
White a deed of conveyance which deed of
conveyance is recorded in the Clerk's office of the
Estill County Court a copy of same will be filed
in due time and when filed is made a part
of this Bill and afterwards the said White
conveyed the same by deed of Mortgage to one
George Calmer to secure to the said Calmer
the payment of five hundred dollars loaned
Money which deed of Mortgage was recorded in
the Clerk's office of (the now) County of Breathitt
