

This Indenture made this 20th day of February 1808
between Margus Calmes of Woodford County Kentucky
of the one part and James Barnett of Madison
County Virginia of the other part: Witnesseth that
the said Calmes for and in consideration of a land
given by said Calmes to Francis Blunt for two
hundred and fifty acres of land lying level, with
a constant running spring on it, and to be as good
as any in the state of Kentucky except some few
prime spots, to be in the state of Kentucky, and
dated the 8th day of Sept. 1780 and assigned by said
Blunt to said Barnett which land is the same
land given in to said Calmes, has granted, bargained
and sold and by these presents, doth grant, bargain
sell alien and confirm to the said Barnett a
certain tract or parcel of land lying and being sit
the mouth of the middle fork of the Kentucky river
Beginning at the mouth of said River at a mark
ed Lyeamore and running South 80 E 160 poles
down the north or main fork to the Lynns creek
main or north fork opposite Jacob Millers and
of the mouth of A. B. thence S 76 E 230 poles to
two white oaks on the point of a hill corner to
A. Barnett, J. Barnett, and John Rose, thence
N 37 W 240 poles to two dogwoods and Gum
Corner between said J. Barnett and Rose, thence
N 45 E 80 poles to a large Elm near the Bank
of middle fork, thence down the middle fork
the several meanders thereof to the Beginning
