

Copy of notes of Thomas Hart, deceased, that accompany a plat a copy of which I also made on the 29th day of Dec. 1889 Survey made in the year 1849 as shown by letter written by Mr. Thomas Hart to Andrew Logwell for whom the survey was made

S 81° W 23³⁵ poles to a sugar tree then ran the call of John Canan and Thomas Franklin Patenti

N 9° W 282 poles to a white oak lettered J. H. on the north side of the road leading from Irvine to Proctor

Same course continued

320 poles to a black oak on a drain lettered "M" with 1 chop on same

N 9° W 320 poles to white oak lettered J. H. with 2 chops above said letters the second mile tree from the river standing on the west side and about 4 poles from a fork of Contrary called the coal Bank Fork

N 9° W 320 poles to a spruce pine lettered J. H. in the branch at the falls of the Cole Fork of Contrary creek the 3rd mile from the river and three chops on said spruce pine

N 9° W 272 poles to the north side of road from Irvine to the north Fork lettered J. H.

N 9° W 320 poles to a white oak then (staid all night in a Rock house) lettered J. H. with 4 chops above said letter being 4 miles from said river

N 9° W 110 poles to the top of the cliff of a Fork of Big Sinking fork triangle across Sinking to a high pine S 8 1/2° W
N 70° W 17 1/2 poles N 1 1/2° W to said
