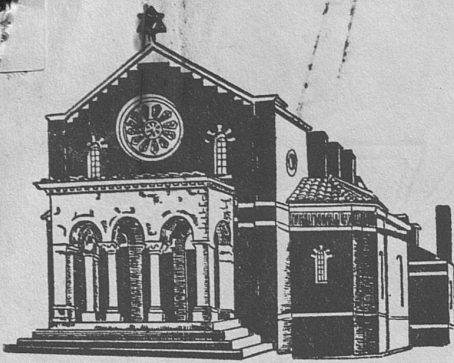

PURCHASE OF A RABBINICAL GOWN has been authorized by the Board for the use of the Rabbi in the pulpit. The gown will probably be available for Rosh Hashana. The stole, however, the design of which is based on the Tallis, is at present out of stock and will be obtained at a later date.

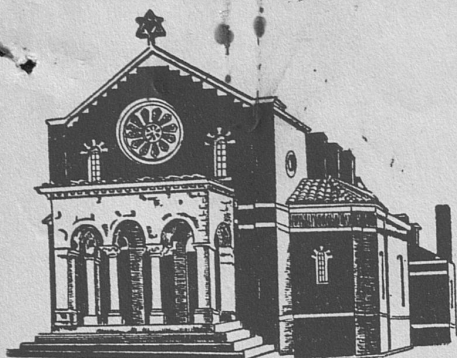

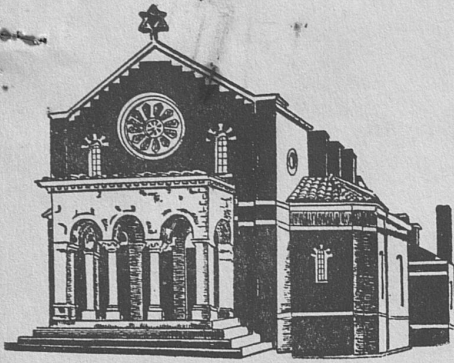
STATION WLEX will broadcast our services on Rosh Hashana Eve and Yom Kippur Eve.

UNION NEWS


Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Samuel S. Hollender of Chicago, National Chairman of the Combined Campaign of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion will be on the Message of Israel this Sunday morning, November 28.

A campaign for \$1,829,000 for maintenance of the UAHC and the HUC-JIR is now in progress. In announcing this campaign Dr. Nelson Glueck, president of HUC-JIR and Dr. Maurice Eisendrath, president of the UAHC, stressed the urgency of adequate financing for the institutions of Liberal Judaism and said:-

"American Jewry, in the enthusiasm of crisis fund-raising for European DPs and the upbuilding of Palestine has neglected its own cultural and religious institutions. And this at a time when the destruction of European centers of Jewish learning placed added responsibility on our American institutions.

We will do irreparable damage to the structure of American Jewry, as well as Jewry in general, if we do not give full support to the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion.

Surely, we are a great and prosperous enough community that we do not have to make a choice. We must support the needs of world Jewry, but we must also support the institutions and organizations that are devoted to our cultural and religious life in the United States. If we neglect our Jewish traditions, we lose our spiritual raison d'etre. We must train a qualified group of young men for Jewish religious leadership; unless we keep a strong congregational life in American Judaism, we will be untrue to our ancient heritage."

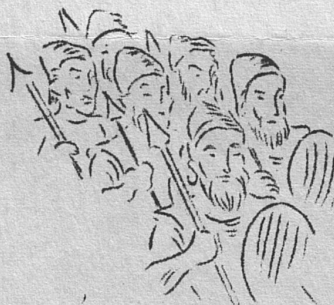

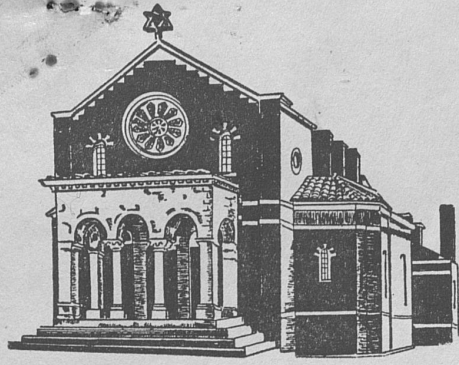
