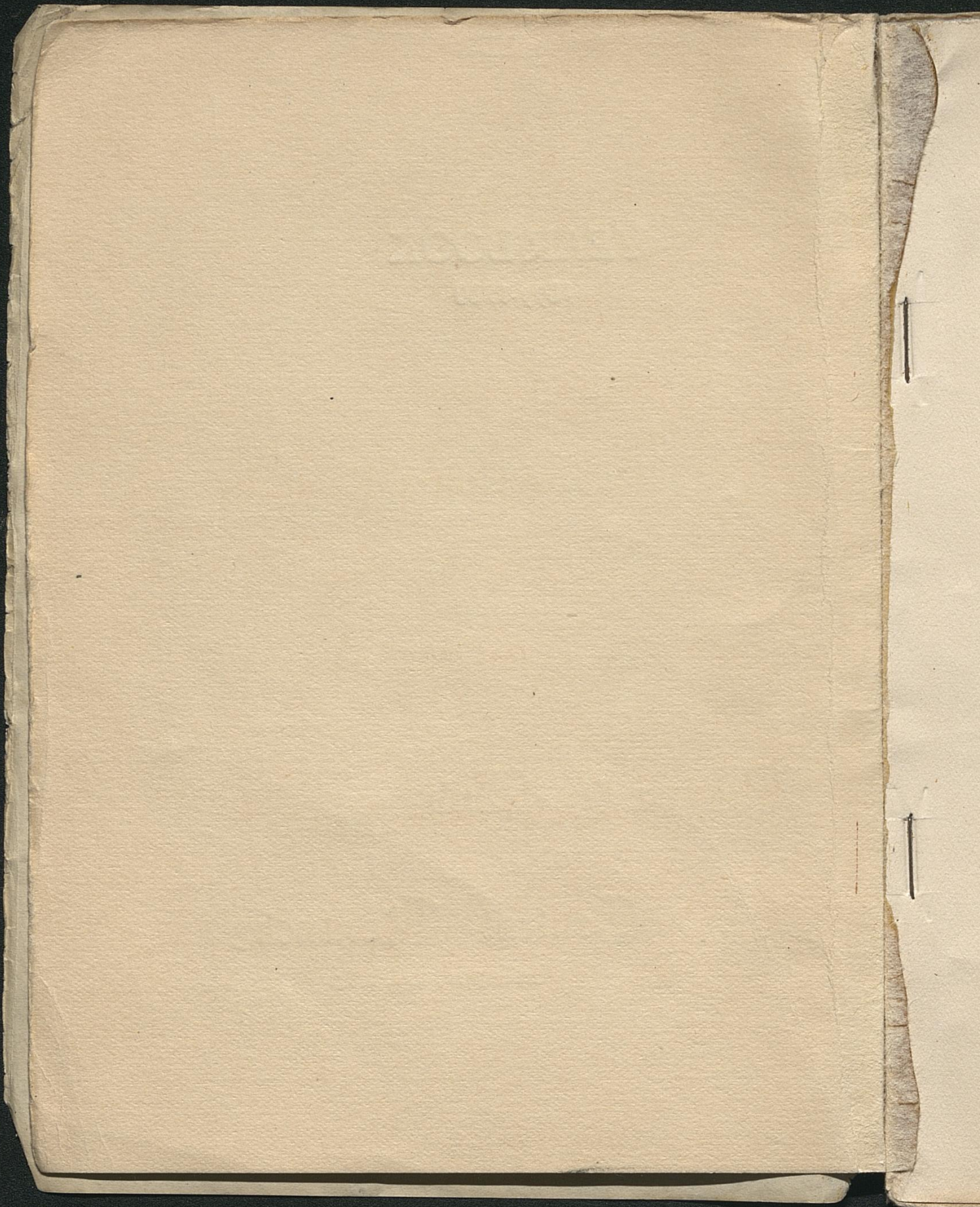

Changes in Constitution, 1897-9.

ARTICLE IV

SEC. 2.—NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

—The officers shall be elected by ballot at a meeting held annually on the first Saturday in *March* and shall be installed in office on the first Saturday in *June*. The Club Year shall begin with October.

A committee on election shall be appointed to consist of three members of the club, who shall serve as Tellers at the annual meeting and shall have power to choose assistants. The chairman of this committee shall be the Corresponding Secretary. A blank ballot shall be mailed to each member of the club, which shall be filled in and returned to the Corresponding Secretary. The names of the three persons receiving the highest number of votes for each office shall be presented at the annual meeting, and the candidates receiving a majority of the votes of those present at said annual meeting shall be declared elected.

Annual Meeting.

An annual meeting of the Club shall be held on the first Saturday in *March* of each year.

Board of Directors.

The chairman of each of the standing committees shall be a member of the Board of Directors.

Changes in By-Laws, 1897-9

ARTICLE II.

SEC. 2.—DUTIES OF CHAIRMAN.—At the open meeting in *May* the chairman of each department shall report the work of her department during the year.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 2.—DUES.—Members entering the club at any time during the Club year, shall pay an initiation fee of three dollars, and be exempt from annual dues for that Club year.

SEC. 8.—Members of the Club having dropped out and wishing to be re-admitted, shall make application directly to the Board of Directors through the President.

ARTICLE VII.

PAYMENT OF FEES.—The annual fee shall be paid to the Treasurer by each member at the open meeting in *October*, or within thirty days thereafter, otherwise the member is dropped.
