TO THE STOCKHOLDERS:

We made very little progress last winter, on account of limited money and scarcity of labor and material. We ordered a survey made of our properties last fall, but the winter set in before Mr. Fred T. Crandall, Mining Engineer of Salmon, Idaho, could get started on the work and it had to be held over until this spring, or until the snow was off the ground.

Our Manager, Mr. Camele Rock, who is a practical mine man of many years' experience is in charge of the work. The object of the survey was to have our mine claims Patented by the U. S. Government. In order that you may clearly understand the procedure, we herewith, give you a copy of Mr. Camele Rock's letters:

Salmon, Idaho, May 31st, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:

Your letter of the 25th., received and I note very carefully what you said about the roads. I will use my best judgment in keeping them from washing and make the cost as little as possible. As to the extension of the time on our patent papers from the Government there will be no trouble. It was cold and snowed last night. Snowing in the mountains today.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, June 18, 1920

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

Enclosed you will find blank annual statement of the Department of State to be filled out. I have just returned from the mine and we will get our surveying started just as soon as the weather will permit. I was just speaking to Mr. Crandall, and he says it is no use to force it, as it will cost us more money than there is any use of, but we will do it as soon as it can be done in a reasonable way. I have delivered your message to the Shoups and they both asked me if you would be here this summer.

CAMELE ROCK.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

I have just returned from the mine. Mr. Crandall with five men are at work and pushing the surveying as fast as possible. We fought the water, as the snow is leaving very fast, but kept the road from washing out. I was talking to Professor Bradford of Salt Lake. He promised a report on our ore sent him from the mine, as soon as possible. I will visit the Harmony Mines' new mill as soon as I can get away, and report to you.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, June 30, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

Your letter with check enclosed received O. K. I got down from the mine Saturday night and brought three of the men. The surveying is all done but we have got to run a cut on the Catherine No. 1, so I still have three men employed and it will take them a few days. I am going up in the morning. Will write you again in a few days.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, July 13, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

I have just returned from the mine and am glad to inform you that the surveying is finished. Mr. Crandall is working on the maps and hopes to complete them within a few days. I will have to take a man up to the mine again today to help make some measurements that were omitted. I will let you know every few days how we are progressing. I am very anxious to get the maps finished so that the notification from the Land Office can be posted on the ground for 60 days. I will let you know from time to time how things are coming. I will send you my pay roll and bills for this month, just as soon as possible. I have spent just about \$600.00 this month. Everything is O. K. and I feel pleased with it.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, July 20, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

As I stated to you a day or two ago that I had just returned from the mine with my measurements all O. K. I was at the Court House today and looked over the maps with Mr. Crandall, and they look alright. The measurements which I gave him were exactly right and just what he wanted. He will keep working at it until it is finished. The Harmony Mines Company has started their mill, and they informed me that it was running very successfully, turning out about a thousand pounds of concentrate an hour. They seem to be very enthusiastic over it. We are having very hot weather, the hottest summer we have ever seen in Lemhi county, but, as we know, it will not last long.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, July 30, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

Your letter of the 22nd., just received. In regard to your paying the \$5.00 per acre to the Government; they will make a demand on us for the amount of money as soon as the maps and tracings are accepted. As soon as they are accepted we will be notified, and we will be supplied with a notice to be posted on the ground. How long it will be before these maps and tracings will be accepted, I cannot tell you. I saw Mr. Crandall today and he thought he might be able to finish them and get them off in tomorrow's mail. He has them finished but is copying this data on the typewriter. I will get a copy of his data and also a copy of the map and will forward same to you.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, August 3, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

Have mailed maps and data to government, copy of same to you. As soon as the government accepts these and we have our claims all posted in accordance to the land laws we will get our patent papers, same as Deed to the property, which will protect all stockholders in the N. W. Dev. Co., which will cost us near \$1500.00. With kindest regards to all interested.

CAMELE ROCK.

Salmon, Idaho, August 3, 1920.

Mr. Thomas Boggess:—

Enclosed you will find map and field notes as Mr. Crandall got them out. He completed them yesterday afternoon and mailed them at once, so they left Salmon this morning for the U. S. Land Office. We owe Mr. Crandall \$258.00, for field work and as soon as the report is accepted we will owe the government about \$600.00. Everything looks fine for us as far as I know.

CAMELE ROCK.

The only debts we owe are given in Mr. Rock's letter of the 3rd. Up to the present time we have kept everything paid as we went along.

The only salaries we have are our Managers at Salmon, Idaho, and such labor as he employs. We pay him \$150.00 per month and his expenses, which amounts to about \$200.00 per month. The money received from the sale of stock all goes into the operation of the property. There are no salaries, nor commissions, paid to any of the officers of the company.

We are going to need about \$2000.00 at once to meet the expense of having our property patented. If each stockholder will subscribe from \$40.00 to \$100.00 of additional stock, this will give us the money to meet all expenses for taking out our Patents.




