Whereas J. B. O'Banion has been arraigned before the Faculty for repeated and contumacious violations of the military regulations of this College and for gross disrespect to the Commandant, and whereas said O'Banion has admitted his offence,

Charges against Cad J. B. O'Banion
Disobedience of orders and breach of arrest.

Resolutions in the case of J. B. O'Banion

expressed repentance thereof and promised a correct deportment for the future, therefore Resolved:

Cadet O'Bannion shall be required to appear before the students in the Chapel at such time as the President shall appoint, and then and there distinctly express regret for his misconduct, apologize to the Commandant and pledge himself strictly to observe in future all regulations of the College.

This substitute being adopted by the Faculty Cadet O'Bannion was performed of the resolution.

Faculty met in called meeting at 12 M. in the President's room. Present were: Pres^r Patterson, Prof^r Kirby, Peter, Shackford, White, Neville, Meux, Helveti, R. B. Paterson, Cadet E. D. Scott, Peace and Col. Phelps. Object of meeting, as stated by the President, charges against Cadet E. D. Scott, brought before the Faculty from the Board of Discipline. The charges are: Cutting a fellow student with intent to wound, without provocation. After the charges had been amended so as to read, without sufficient provocation. Cadets Agee, Hampton, Stanley, Long, Offutt, Duan and the wounded Cadet Maxum were heard as witnesses in the case, Cadet Scott and his father being present. Cadet Scott and his father then having withdrawn the accused was found guilty as charged, by a ^{unanimous} vote of 4, and it was moved and seconded that he, Cadet E. D. Scott be dismissed from College. Reading his motion, Faculty adjourned for further consideration of the case until Jan. 14th 1. P. M. at the same place.
