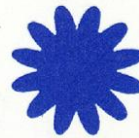

JOE B. HALL Head Basketball Coach

Basketball, horse racing, and tobacco are all cornerstones in the cultural tradition of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. It's difficult to say which one is deemed the most significant, but all are considered to be in expendable. That is why basketball at the University of Kentucky is not just a game, it is a way of life. The sport is revered by Kentuckians as something extra special.

The responsibility of perpetuating this seemingly irreversible basketball trend at U.K. belongs to Joe B. Hall. Joe was sworn in as the head coach of the Wildcats in 1972, succeeding the fabled Adolf Rupp and being surrounded by Rupp's ever-present legend. So often a coaching transition of this type is not as silky smooth as it was intended to be. Many a coach has met failure when he could not reach the high standards set by a high and mighty predecessor. This is not so for Joe Hall.

As Hall began competing in the S.E.C., he found a vastly improved league in which lower division teams could not be taken lightly, as had been the case in previous years. Joe's first Wildcat entry of 1972-73 carried the Big Blue banner to the S.E.C. pinnacle. It was a season with many trying moments and with a painfully slow start, but Hall patiently rounded his team into championship style. Hall was voted by his fellow coaches in the league as the S.E.C. Coach of the Year, the only rookie coach ever so honored. Last year's squad never realized contender status but the 1974-75 team is again regarded as a threat for the S.E.C. flag.

Joe Hall is a gentleman on and off the court. He personifies decency, and he has the respect of his own men as well as his opponents. With his high level of character, intelligence, and ability as a coach, he will continue to achieve excellence for Kentucky basketball.



ALL-AMERICAN

KEVIN GREVEY

Forward

6'5", 205 lbs., Sr.

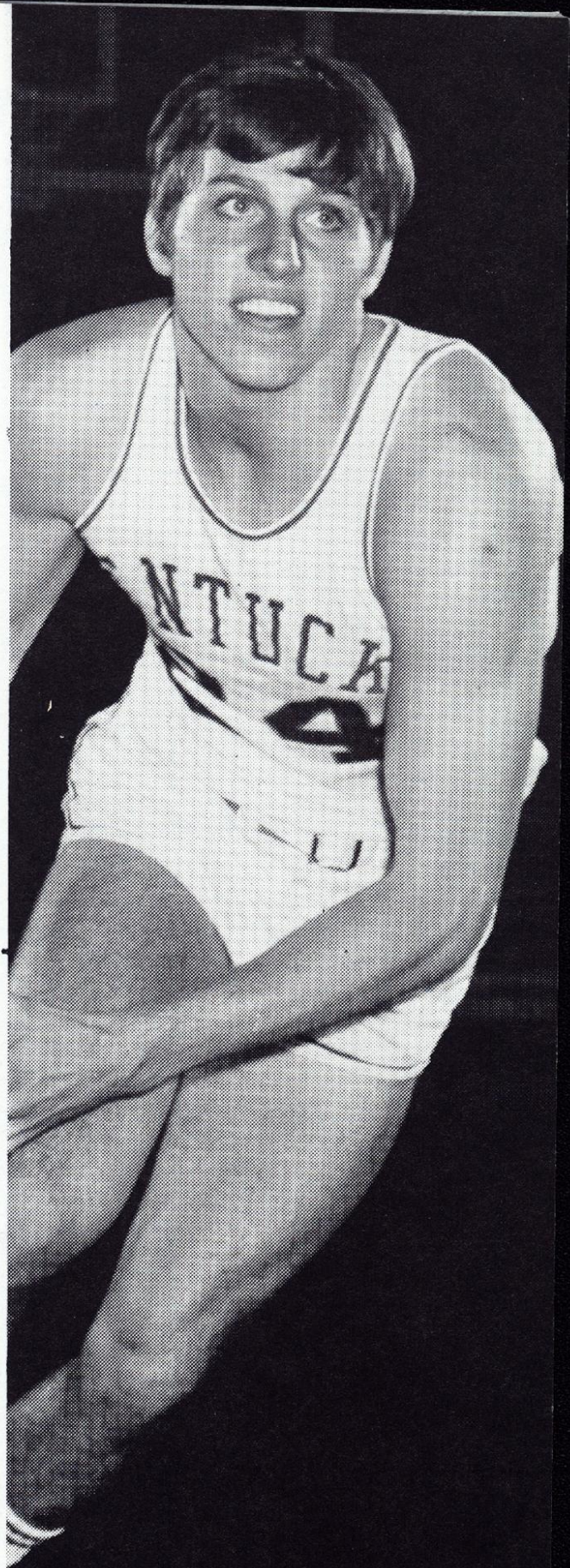
Kevin Grevey has been a star for the Wildcats for the past two years, and should cross the threshold into superstardom as a Senior. Twice he has been an All S.E.C. honoree and was the league's MVP in his sophomore season. Last year he toted a hefty 21.9 scoring average, which was the highest mark in the conference for all games played. Kevin was accurate on 50.8% of his fielders and netted 83% of his free throws. He was second to Guyette in rebounds with 7.2 per game, was the team's leading scorer in 18 games, scored 30 or better three times, and 20 or more in 14 contests. Kevin is Kentucky's 26th All American and is destined to be remembered as one of the school's greatest players.

MIKE FLYNN

Guard

6'3", 190 lbs., Sr.

Mike Flynn started his varsity career at Kentucky in a sophomore season which saw him struggle to get his game together. He has worked to refine his style and has developed into a solid player for the Big Blue. Mike started every game last year, the only Wildcat to do so. He had a respectable average in both scoring and rebounding, scoring 11.5 points and pulling down 5.9 missed shots per game, while generally having to guard the opposition's hottest hand. His 87 assists for the season was the team's high mark in that category. Mike is married, the only Wildcat to take that giant step thus far, and is the proud father of a son who was born last June. Mike Flynn could have his best season ever as a senior.





RICK ROBEY

Center

6'10", 235 lbs., Fr.

Rick Robey, who many considered to be one of the top two or three college prospects in the land, will be working wonders for the Wildcats as a freshman. An authentic blue chipper, Rick was everybody's All-America at Brother Martin High School in New Orleans a year ago. He led his team to the state championship, was MVP in the state tournament competition, and was the state's Player of the Year. For the year he blinked the scoreboard lights at an average of 21 points per game and grabbed 18 rebounds per battle. Rick possesses good strength and is exceptionally quick for a man of his physical stature. He is another reason why the Cats are so optimistic about the 1974-75 season.

1974-75 WILDCAT PREVIEW

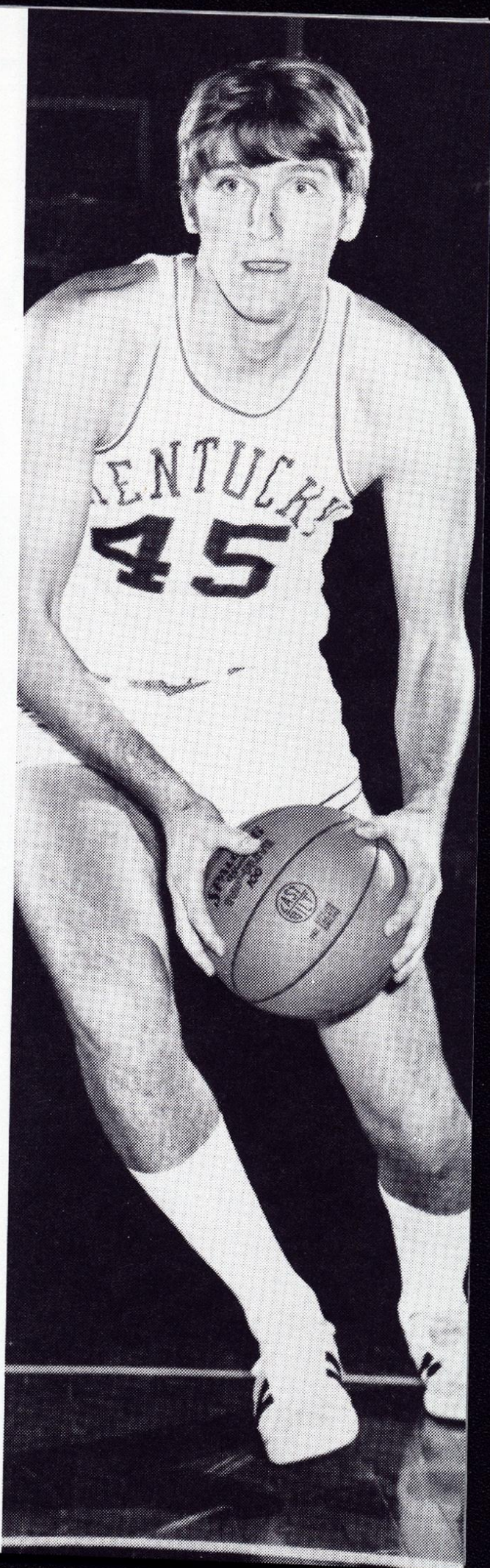
A quick look back at the performance of the Kentucky Wildcats last year uncovers an atypical year for the Big Blue, a season that could be described as mediocre at best. But that was last year. This season the Cats are back on the prowl, hungrier than ever, and heavily stocked with talented personnel.

All-American Kevin Grevey returns at forward where he has been a pillar of strength for two years. Bob Guyette, Merion Haskins, and freshman Jack Givens are hammering for the starting nod at the other forward none of which has the job nailed down at this point. In the back court Jimmy Dan Conner will be a steady force at one guard while the race between Mike Flynn and Larry Johnson to see who starts opposite Conner is so close that Joe Hall may have to toss the coin. The most encouraging news is at center where either Mike Phillips or Rick Robey will fill the vacuum. Both these brawny lads are freshman, but Hall feels they represent immediate advancement to title contention. Others who will likely play key roles as substitutes are G. J. Smith, Jerry Hale, James Lee, Ernie Whitus, and Joey Holland.

From the incoming freshman class the Cats will receive a more effective center, plus a substantially bettered quality of the reserve platoon. Kentucky will be a stonger rebounding team than last year's squad and will have significantly more offensive fire power. Just how well the Cats do may depend upon how rapidly the key freshmen develop into S.E.C. quality players. With the abundance of talent at hand, the Cats could return to their familiar position atop the S.E.C. GO BIG BLUE!

BOB GUYETTE
Center-Forward
6'9", 236 lbs., Sr.

Though used predominantly as a center in the past two years, Bob will see action as a swing man in his final year as a Wildcat. This is a natural move in that it will take advantage of his ability to score from the 15-foot perimeter. His connecting on 55.7% of his shots from the field is proof that he is a very capable shooter. Against LSU he was near perfect, missing only one shot in eleven field goal tries for 90.9%, a school single game record. Besides being a fine athlete, his most noteworthy achievements may eventually prove to be his performance in the classroom. Bob had a 4.0 mark the second semester of his junior year as a pre-dentistry major, and is a bona fide Rhodes Scholar candidate. He should repeat as a member of the All S.E.C. and All America academic squads.



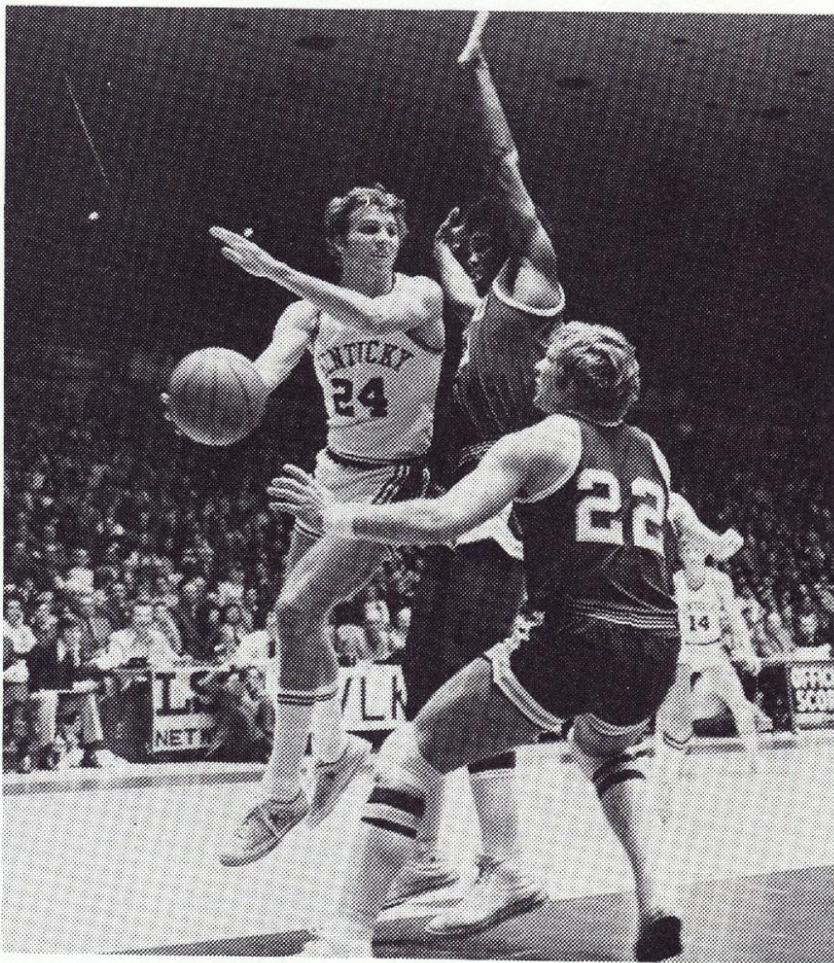


G. J. SMITH
Forward
6'7", 190 lbs., Sr.

One of the more valuable non-starters on this year's Kentucky team should be G. J. Smith. Though relegated to be a substitute, G. J. has two years experience and this will increase the strength of Hall's reserve corps. G. J. played in all but one of Kentucky's 26 games last year, and started four times. He is a very good outlet passer, pulling down a rebound and firing down court to trigger the famed Wildcat fast break. G. J.'s best game came against Alabama, when he entered the game and poured in 15 points. He averaged 4.1 points and 2.6 rebounds per game for his team last winter. Smith could be the first reserve at forward this year for the Big Blue.

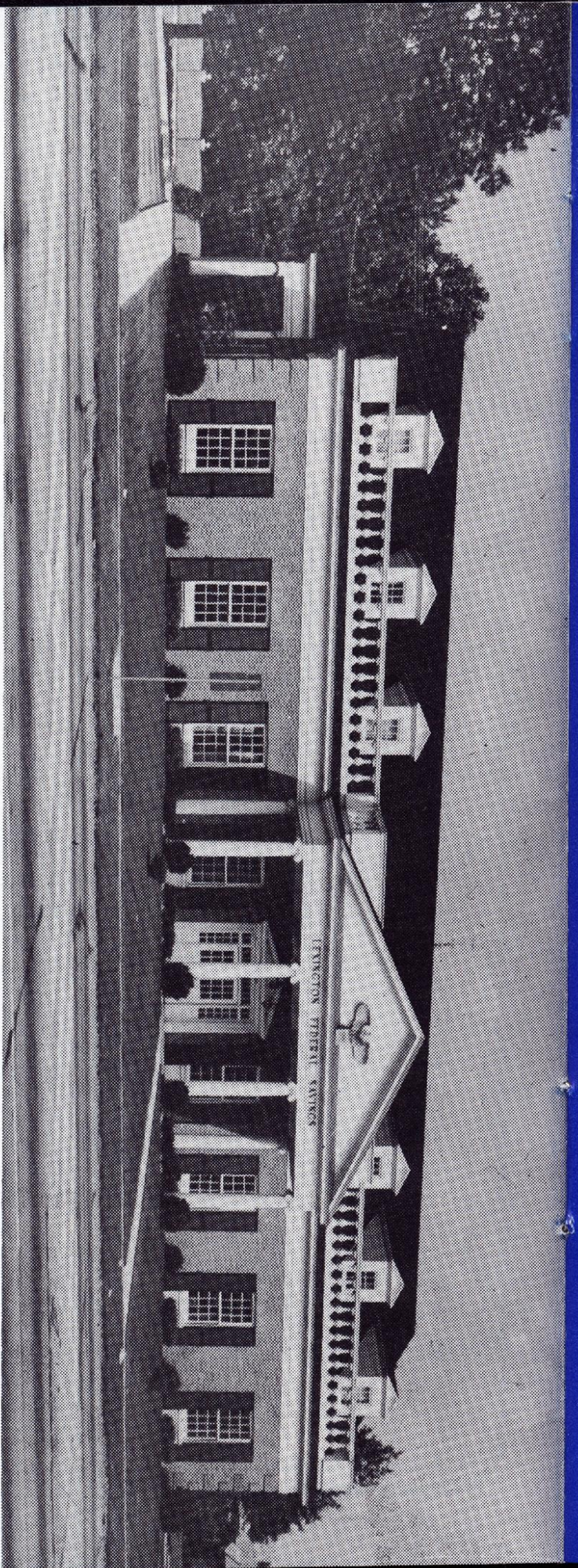

JIMMY DAN CONNER
Guard

6'4", 190 lbs., Sr.

Jimmy Dan Conner has been employed primarily as a forward for the past two years, but this season Hall has decided to move the Senior to guard on a permanent basis. This is a welcomed move by Jimmy Dan, who feels more at home as a guard. Conner is a typical Kentucky ball player in that he can do many things well. Last year 52% of his field goal attempts were two pointers, had 75 assists, averaged 12 points and 4.4 rebounds per outing, along with being one of the team's most tenacious defenders. Perhaps more important are the intangible qualities he possesses such as leadership, desire, and a thirst to be a winner. This former Mr. Basketball of Kentucky is determined to help reinstate the Wildcats in the number one position of the S.E.C.

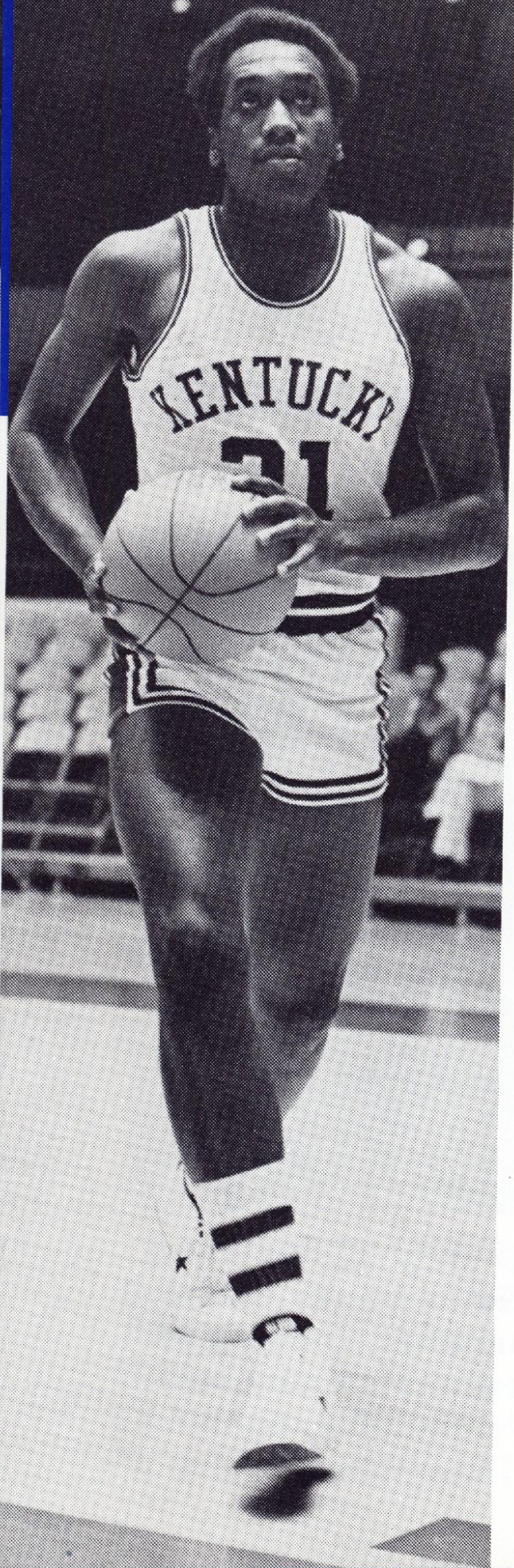

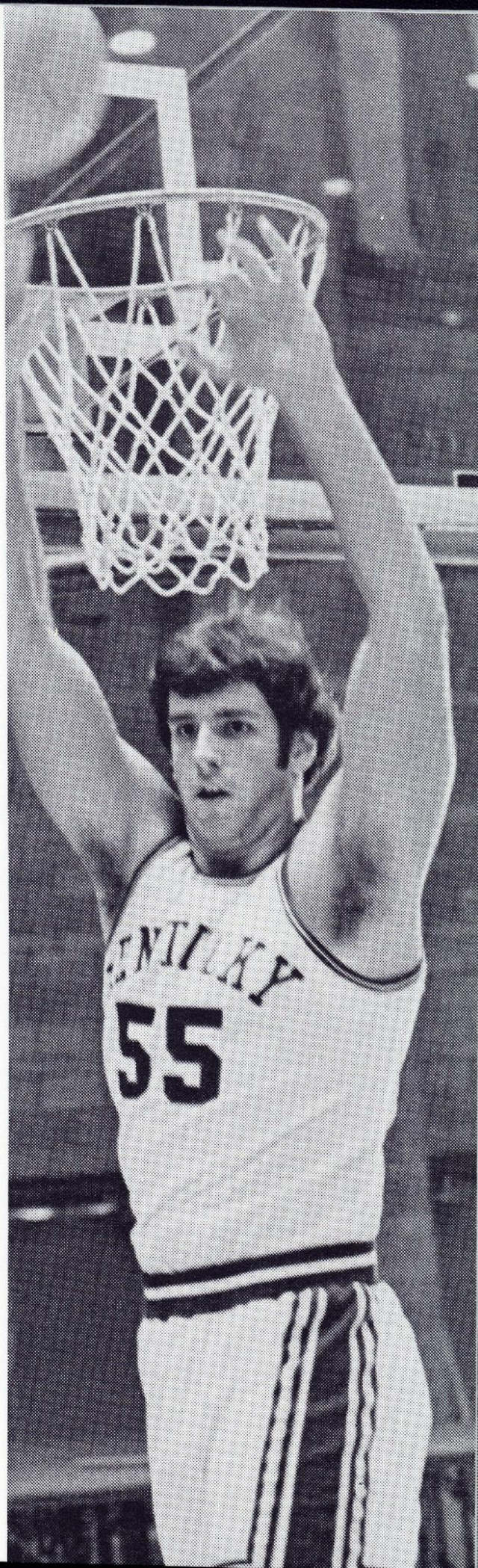


JACK GIVENS
Forward-Guard
6'4", 200 lbs., Fr.

Jack Givens is a freshman who performs with the polish and confidence of a veteran. Already Joe Hall feels he has the tools to compete for the starting five, and Givens and Haskins are neck and neck in the race to see who starts at forward. Though only 6'4" in height, Givens can rebound with the seven footers with his kangaroo-like leaping ability. He owns the rebounding record in Kentucky State Tourney play by pulling down 25 errant shots in one game last March. He was an All-American high schooler at Bryan Station, where he averaged 25 points and 17 rebounds a game as a center for his club. The Wildcat staff believes he has unlimited potential and should become an all star player for the Big Blue.

MIKE PHILLIPS
Center
6'10", 240 lbs., Fr.

Mike Phillips had such a sensational high school career that college scouts from across the nation came knocking at his door and invited him to attend their school. He led Manchester to the State AA Championship and a 26-0 record last year. In his junior season, Manchester lost one game, the one in which Mike did not play because of an injury. His career totals border on the incredible, scoring 2,573 points in four years to eclipse the seemingly indestructible record of 2,460 points held by Jerry Lucas. Mike averaged 32.3 points and 23.5 rebounds per game for his team as a senior. Understandably, this two-time player of the year in Ohio and prep All-American is being counted on to step in and contribute to the Big Blue cause at the high post this year.





JERRY HALE

Guard

6'0", 175 lbs., Sr.

Jerry Hale is a spirited player who gives his all and is appreciated by the fans for his scrappy play. Accordingly, Hale received the Kiwanis 110 Percenter Award last season for showing such desire on the court. He is a crafty ball handler who makes a minimum number of mistakes; in fact, he was responsible for only ten turnovers in a 141 minutes of play last year. Jerry is an unselfish player who will give up a shot to hit a teammate for what he considers to be a better percentage shot. Coach Hall had planned on Hale as being one of the top reserves, but an acute case of tendinitis in the knee may reduce his playing time.

JAMES LEE
Forward
6'5", 220 lbs., Fr.

James Lee was one of the most heralded high school players ever to play in the Lexington area. He starred at Henry Clay High, leading his team to two Central Kentucky conference titles, two district championships, and one regional title. James was selected as an all-stater and as an All-America. He is a gifted shooter from the outside and can lay the ball down and feather it in with soft shots from the inside. Lee considers his most notable round-ball achievement came when he out dueled Moses Malone in the one-on-one championship in the past Derby Classic. He is recognized to be one of the strongest players to suit up for the Cats in many years and should see plenty of playing time this year.





MERION HASKINS

Forward

6'7", 200 lbs., Soph.

Merion Haskins advances to the U.K. varsity with some very impressive credentials from the 1973-74 jayvee squad. He was good on 50% of his shots from the field to lead the team in scoring with 18.6 points a game and also led in rebounds with 11.3. Merion made even further progress during the Australian tour, pulling one game out of the fire with a steal and an assist, which threw the game into overtime and enabled the Cats to win. With this kind of showing, Hall feels he is ready to help the Big Blue this season. His excellent leaping ability and potential to score inside will insure him of seeing plenty of game time this year. Haskins comes from a basketball playing family, as his brother Clem is a standout in the pro ranks.

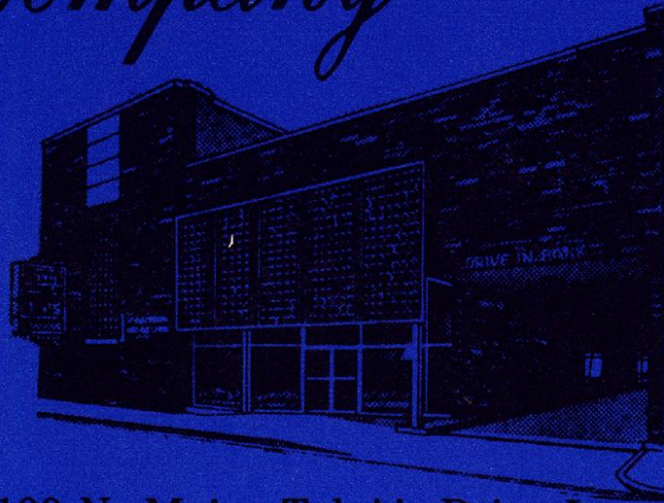

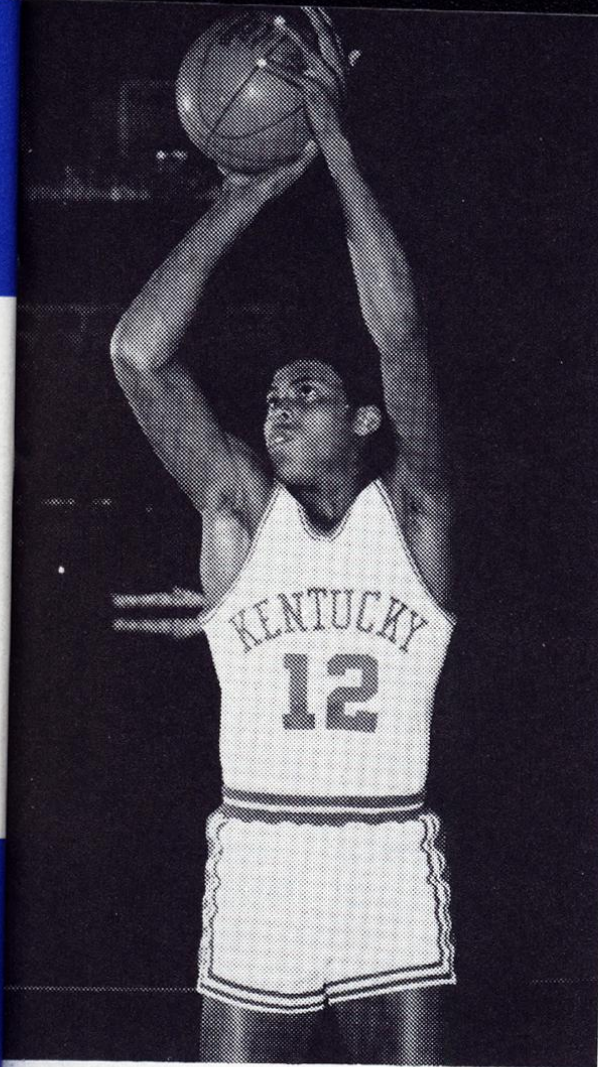

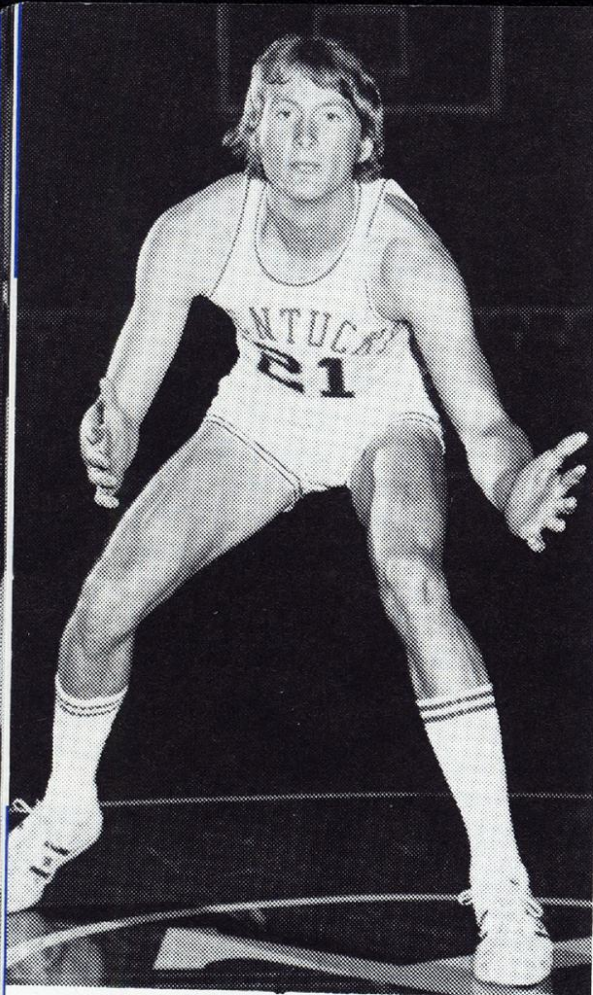
LARRY JOHNSON
