The Faculty convened in regular session, Dr. Pryor, Capt. Swigert, Prof. German were noted as absent. The minutes of four previous meetings were read, corrected, and approved as corrected.

Censure  
L. S. Barber

in a fire at  
Geol. Lab.

Mr. L. S. Barber was called in and, through the President, received the censure of the Faculty, as recommended at the meeting of April 6, 1895. Upon motion of Prof. Nelson it was resolved to make the censure a matter of record. The censure follows:

"The Faculty at their last meeting, endeavored by enquiry to ascertain the cause of the fire which was discovered in the Lecture room of Prof. German on the morning of the 19th of March, and which might, but for its timely discovery, have involved the whole building in flames.

They concluded that it was due, in all probability to your forgetfulness or neglect to turn off the gas which you had been using in your Laboratory work, late in the afternoon of the preceding day.

The Faculty therefore directed me to express their sense of your delinquency in the premises, and for this delinquency to censure you in their name and by their authority.

I now formally comply with these instructions, and in the presence of the Faculty you stand censured accordingly."

Class marching.

The report of the Committee appointed to consider the matter of class marching was submitted. The report was unfavorable to any change in the present system, and recommended its more rigid enforcement.

Prof. W. K. Patterson moved, as a substi-

ture to the report, the following:-

Class marching

"Whereas, the regulations of the College relating to Class-marching have been a dead letter for the past five years; and whereas, their nominal enforcement for the past year and a half has been the cause of great confusion and disorder, and much loss of time; Resolved, that the Faculty recommend to the Board of Trustees that they repeal those sections of the regulations that relate to Section Marching and Section Marchers, and that they cause a bell to be placed in the tower of the Main Building to be rung by the janitor at the close of each recitation hour."

No action was taken upon this substitute, and on motion the Faculty adjourned to meet Monday, May 6, 3 p.m.
