The Secretary read the following resolution on the death of Mr. Howell D. Spears, Chemist in the Department of Feed and Fertilizer Control in the Experiment Station:

"Howell Davis Spears, Senior Chemist in the Department of Feed and Fertilizer Control of the Experiment Station, died at his home in Lexington on the morning of May 4, 1940, age 53 years. He was a tireless, painstaking and efficient worker and his long experience in all phases of feed control work made him an invaluable State and Federal control official. In his untimely death our institution lost a loyal and efficient worker and his associates an agreeable co-worker and a staunch and valued friend.

Mr. Spears was born in Lexington, Kentucky, March 5, 1887, son of John Esten and Kate Warfield Spears. He received his B. S. degree from the State College of Kentucky in 1907 and his M. S. in 1908 and did post-graduate work here in 1911 and in 1927-28. He entered the Experiment Station as student assistant chemist in the Food Laboratory in 1906 and of the Department of Feed Control in the following year, where he continued as chemist until the union of the Feed and Fertilizer Control Departments in 1939 when he became Senior Chemist of the consolidated departments.

He was an active and progressive worker, doing much research work on subjects relating to feedstuffs; collaborator on many methods under consideration by the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists on analysis of feedstuffs; and joint author in all the published reports of

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
the Department of Feed Control. He was consulting chemist to the City of Lexington, 1918-1933, by permission of our Board of Trustees, and made valuable contributions to the subject of sewage disposal during that period. Under a similar permission of the Board of Trustees of the University, he was technical and operating adviser for the sewage disposal plant of the City of Lexington from 1936 until his death.

He was a member of the American Chemical Society, the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists, the Association of American Feed Control Officials, Sigma Xi, a charter member of the Kentucky Academy of Science, the Research Club of the University of Kentucky, the Alumni Association of the University of Kentucky, Active Secretary of his Class, 1907, and a member of Phi Delta Theta social fraternity. He was a member of the gymnasium team in 1906-7 of the varsity football team in 1911, and he won the Singles Cup in the Bluegrass Tennis Tournament in 1917.
