#### NEW ISSUE OF LIBRARIES' JOURNAL

Volume IV, Number 3 of The Kentucky Review is now available. It includes Cornell scholar Stephen Parrish's talk on the "archeological" function of the modern Wordsworth editor (given during last fall's Peal festivities); an essay by Donald Livingston (Northern Illinois University) on David Hume's political philosophy, particularly his views of American independence; an article by Stephen Crane biographer Joseph Katz (University of South Carolina) featuring newly-discovered newspaper pieces by Crane; UK historian Robert Ireland's overview of the ineffectiveness of the 19th-century criminal jury, with special reference to Kentucky; and Terry Birdwhistell's account of the library's political oral history program. #### INFORMATION FROM THE PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Basic procedures for the preservation of library or archival holdings should include all or part of the following:

1. Fumigation for insects and/or mold.
2. Surface cleaning, including vacuuming and careful use of erasers and other paper cleaning materials.
3. Washing single sheets of black and white materials in plain water to remove water-soluble stains.
4. Removal of pressure sensitive tape and other foreign materials.
5. Mending with Japanese paper and neutral paste.
6. Reinforcement of paper with paper and neutral paste where there is an image on one side only.
7. Boxing and/or enveloping in neutral pH containers and folders.
8. Removal of corroded or rusty clips, staples, and pins.
9. Separation of highly acidic material from other papers.
10. Deacidification.
11. Polyester encapsulation.
