Remarks:

On August 29 three workers and three book collections of sixty books each were placed out in Fayette County--two in schools and one in a church. On August 31 another worker with her collection was placed in a country church. The fifth book collection is ready and awaiting permission of school authorities for installation September 2.

For two weeks previous, workers had been interviewed and trained and instructed. They had been allowed a good deal of freedom in selection of book collections since we chose workers who would fit into the various kinds of communities and wanted to have their judgment (to some extent) on the books they were to circulate.

The book truck was taken to one school picnic for the purpose of advertisement. Mr. Wilder, assisted by the project supervisor, librarian chosen for the community, and the adult education teacher, held a moving picture show at a county church and speeches were made to introduce the library and the workers.
