April 16th

The President called this meeting of the Faculty to take into consideration an action of some of the students in the compensated labor department.

Messrs Reid, Arnett, Cardwell, Higgins, Nixon, Durioe, Ford, J. C. Forman, Jesse Smith, Hill, DeSha, Jones, and Halby were reported as absenting themselves from work at 7 A.M. April 16th. Messrs DeSha and Halby were also reported as having been, for some time past, very irregular in their work. Mr. DeSha having persistently violated the laws of this institution was privately dismissed. Mr. Halby was directed to go regularly to work or change his quarters.

The other young men stated, as the reason for their refusal to work, that they had not been paid their last month's wages, although it was five or six days later in the month than they are generally paid.

After some explanation in regard to the finances of this College Messrs Reid, Arnett, Cardwell, Higgins, Nixon, Durioe, Ford, Forman, Smith and Hill promised to return to their work, having been assured that their wages would be paid as soon as possible.

On motion the Faculty adjourned.
