

U. & M. College of Kentucky Feb. 7 - 1902.

The Faculty met in the President's room in regular monthly session at 3.30 P. M. those present being President Patterson, Profs. White, W. K. Patterson, Roark, Pryor, Anderson, Matthews, Miller, Peuce, Brooks and Mackenzie.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

As Chairman of Com. upon proposed Summer School, Prof. Miller read a report stating the courses of which it would be possible to offer for the first year, with an estimate of the minimum expenses for such courses. The report was discussed and suggestions made by Profs. Peuce, Patterson, Mackenzie, Roark and Anderson. Upon motion of Prof. Anderson, seconded by Prof. Roark, it was ordered "that further consideration of the subject of a Summer School be postponed"

A communication was read from C. A. Spencer and other students offering an explanation of their action in taking steps to establish a chapter of the Sigma Nu fraternity in this college, without conforming to the regulations of the faculty relating to college fraternities.

Prof. Miller moved that this communication be referred to the Executive Com. of the College for consideration; seconded by Prof. Roark.

After some discussion, Prof. Roark offered as a substitute the following motion which was seconded by Prof. Mackenzie; - "that the recently organized chapter of the Sigma Nu fraternity be refused recognition by this faculty until further advised, and that the whole case, including a transcript of former laws upon the subject, be submitted to the executive Com. at its next meeting with the request that they clearly define the limits of the authority of the faculty in the organization of Greek letter fraternities" The substitute motion was carried.

Lexington, Ky. Feb. 1, 1902

To the President and faculty of The State College of Ky.

As there has been some question raised as to the legality of the installation of ~~Gamma Iota~~ Chapter of The Sigma NU Fraternity the members of the chapter desire to submit the following statements for the information of the President and Faculty of the above named institution.

First:- No rules or regulations concerning Greek Letter Fraternities are included in the "Extracts from the Regulations" which are issued to the students. The only information they are given on this subject being the announcements of the President in chapel to the effect that "Each Fraternity shall submit a list of its members to the Faculty semi-annually" also "That no student below the rank of freshman shall join a fraternity "

Second:- We sent a committee composed of Geo. W. Pickels, Jr. and C. E. Woods to President Patterson to ascertain if there were any regulations pertaining to the installing of Chapters of Fraternities and they were referred by the President to the minutes of the December Meeting of the Board of Trustees. In said minutes they found a record of a rule being passed to the effect that "no more Greek Letter Fraternities should be installed at Kentucky State College without the consent of the Executive Committee".

Third:- The committee then waited on three members, a majority, of the Executive Committee, viz:- R. C. Stoll, Judge KINKEAD, and D. F. Frazee who told them to go ahead and install the chapter.

We naturally took their consent as final and proceeded to install the Chapter on Jan. 18, 1902.

Fourth:- Before doing this we complied ^{with} all laws, rules and regulations known to us.
