The Faculty convened at the call of the Pres. at 11 a.m. The object of the meeting was to consider the expediency of a challenge debate between the State College and Ky. University. The matter was presented to the Faculty by Mr. Felix Herrick, of the Patterson Society, who proposed that State College should send the challenge, that the debate should take place in the State College Chapel, that a prize of \$20.00 should be given to the best disputant, and that the net proceeds of admission fees be divided between Ky. University and State College equally, the share of the latter to be applied to the indebtedness of the Athletic Association.

After a brief discussion the vote of the Faculty was cast adversely to the sending of the challenge.

Prof. Anderson moved that, in view of Mr. R. L. Cowherd long and faithful attendance upon college, and of his sterling character and conscientious work, he be permitted to graduate with the Degree of Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering (B.M.E.). After some discussion, Prof. Nelson moved to refer the matter to a committee consisting of that should report as soon as possible. This motion was amended by Prof. Patterson by naming as the Committee the members of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering. The motion carried as amended.
